The Nurse Practitioner Regulation Framework Implementation Plan Project (NPR-FIPP) is a multi-year, multi-faceted initiative commissioned by the Canadian Council of Registered Nurse Regulators (CCRNR). The NPR-FIPP builds on previous work with a goal to implement the recommendations endorsed by CCRNR regarding six basic elements of a Model for Nurse Practitioner Regulation in Canada.

One of our prime goals of NPAC is to advance and respond to the interests and concerns of nurse practitioners in all areas that affect practice. We consider proposed future regulation of professional practice one such area.

We appreciated being engaged in the process last year. We are requesting that we again be involved in this phase of the framework's development. As the national association, we are an important national stakeholder and leader for nurse practitioners in Canada. We are committed to being present at all

discussions that inform their practice. Only in this way are we able to develop and build this sector of the nursing profession and make the necessary reforms that connect regulation with practice.

As a collaborative partner, we not only welcome participation in the Nurse Practitioner Regulation Framework, but also consider it a responsibility within our mandate.
