Steven Lewis - Keynote Speaker

Steven Lewis is a health policy and health services research consultant, and Adjunct Professor of Health Policy at Simon Fraser University. He led a health research granting agency, created the first evidence-based system improvement organization in Saskatchewan, and was a research director for major provincial and national health care commissions. He served on the National Forum on Health, Health Council of Canada, Health Quality Council of Saskatchewan, and the Governing Council of the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. He has worked with governments, health regions, regulators, professional organizations, and quality improvement agencies, and writes a monthly health policy column for the Saskatoon and Regina newspapers.

Dr. Shafeena Premji, MD, CCFP, MHA, NCMP

Dr. Shafeena Premji is a family physician with a fellowship in Women's Health from Queen's University. She is the founder, owner and medical director of three medical clinics-Mahogany Medical Clinic, The Village Medical and her newest venture, Milestone - Menopause Centre of Southern Alberta. As an entrepreneur, her vision has always been to advance and increase accessibility for women's health care.

She currently practices low risk obstetrics in SE Calgary and dedicates the rest of her clinical time supporting women in midlife, menopause and beyond. She received her Menopause Society Certification (MSCP) in 2015. Dr. Premji serves on the Board of Directors of the Canadian Menopause Society (CMS) and the Medical Advisory Board of the Menopause Foundation of Canada (MFC).

Elder Eagle Speaker

Casey Eagle Speaker, also known as Sorrel Horse, is a respected Blackfoot Elder from the Kainai Nation/Blood Tribe. Casey was taken from his family at just four years of age and placed in a residential school until the age of fourteen. Casey is now the lead Elder for several organizations, including AU Arts. He is the Indigenous Resource Coordinator for Hull Services and also serves as the Chair of the Wisdom Council for Alberta Health Services. He provides traditional counseling, support, guidance, and ceremony for students, staff, families, and individuals and is passionate about equality for all people."

Dr. Jay Patidar, MBBch (Wits), FCP-Peds (S.A.)

Dr. Patidar qualified as an MD in 1979 from the University of Witwatersand, completed a fellowship in pediatrics in 1986 in South Africa. He practice as a consultant pediatrician in South Africa from 1986-1999. He then moved to Brandon Manitoba in 1999. He took up an associate position in department of pediatrics at the University of Alberta in 2004 and has since then been practicing at the Misericordia hospital in general pediatrics with an interest in asthma. He has received multiple teaching awards with having a passion for teaching and lecturing medical student and residents. The Honourable Adriana LaGrange was elected to the Legislative Assembly for Red Deer-North in 2019 and again on May 29, 2023. She was sworn in as Minister of Health on June 9, 2023.

During her first term, Member LaGrange served as the Minister of Education.

Prior to serving with the Legislative Assembly, she was a trustee for the Red Deer Catholic regional school division for over 11 years, during which time she held every position, including board chair and provincial negotiator. She held the position of provincial president of the Alberta Catholic School Trustees' Association from 2015 to 2018 and Vice-President of the Canadian Catholic School Trustees' Association from 2017 to 2018.

Between 1981 and 2006, Member LaGrange intermittently worked for the Michener Centre in Red Deer, where she filled various roles, including as a shift charge, behavioural specialist and social academic.

She has also been involved in managing the family farm and the trucking division of a hog farm partnership since 1984. Over the years she has received numerous accolades for her community work, including having accepted the friend of the Alberta School Councils' Association award in 2017 and the St. Thomas More award in 2018. She has also been recognized by the Michener Centre for her avid volunteerism.
